Thanks to all the members who have provided the local union with a non-VSB email address so that we can communicate directly with you during upcoming collective bargaining with the Vancouver School Board ("local bargaining") and the Provincial government's representatives, the British Columbia Public School Employers' Association ("provincial bargaining").

To date, close to 400 members have registered their non-VSB email address with the local. This is the email address the local will use to, among other things, distribute a collective bargaining survey so that members can have input regarding the proposals raised at the bargaining table.
